To Members of the Faculty:

I am pleased to announce the appointment of Professor Paul E. Gray of the Department of Electrical Engineering as Chairman of the Freshman Advisory Council, beginning with the academic year 1964-1965. Professor Gray succeeds Professor Nathan H. Cook of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, who has skillfully guided the affairs of the Council over the past three years. We are indebted to Professor Cook for a job well-done.

Professor Gray has been a member of the Council since 1960 and of the Council's Executive Committee since 1962. He has given special direction to lecture programs of professional interest to the entering class. A member of the Class of 1954, he received the advanced degrees of M.S. in 1955 and Sc.D. in 1960, and has been a Ford Postdoctoral Fellow in engineering, 1961-1963.

The Freshman Advisory Council was organized in 1952 to assist entering students with the mechanics of registration. From this modest beginning, the Council over the intervening years has pioneered a number of ventures designed to establish continuing meaningful associations with our youngest colleagues. Currently, 83 members of the faculty, representing all departments, provide a broad variety of advisory services to freshmen and to sophomores who have not affiliated with a professional department.
