Eugene Mirabelli, who has just become professor emeritus of civil engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, will continue his long teaching career on a part-time basis as lecturer.

Professor Mirabelli was born in Boston in 1898 and received the bachelor's degree jointly from Harvard and M.I.T. in 1918. After working briefly in industry, he returned to M.I.T. in 1920 as an instructor in civil engineering. He became assistant professor of structural design in 1928 and associate professor of civil engineering ten years later.

An authority on structural design and analysis, Professor Mirabelli has been an active consultant on a number of local building projects. In 1959 he was a member of the study group formed to establish a uniform state building code for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Professor Mirabelli has been a member of several departmental committees in addition to his teaching responsibilities. He is a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, the Boston Society of Civil Engineers, the American Concrete Institute, and the American Society of Engineering Education.

Professor and Mrs. Mirabelli live at 44 Somerset Road, Lexington, Mass. They have two sons, Eugene, Jr., and Richard, both of whom are alumni of M.I.T.
