Fifty-two mid-career executives from industry, business, government, and education, make up the largest class ever to be accepted in the Alfred P. Sloan Fellows Program at the Sloan School of Management, Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Unlike most academic programs at M.I.T. or elsewhere, the Sloan Fellows Program has already begun its working academic year, 1969-70.

In addition to being the largest, the class is scoring some other interesting "firsts" among its new Sloan Fellows:

- two men from the Soviet Union (Messrs. Bykov and Dudnikov)
- two men from the black community (Messrs. Jones and Mitchell)
- the first representative of urban management (Edgar A. Vaughn, Jr.)
- the first manager of an elementary school system (Charles Mitchell, Jr.)
- the first journalist (Richard J. C. Roeber)
- the chief design engineer of the Apollo Lunar Module (Thomas J. Kelly)

Organizations which are represented in the Sloan Fellows Program for the first time, starting with this class, are: the Cabot Corporation; Canadian Government; City of Atlanta, Georgia; Delta Airlines; Gulf Oil Corporation; Highland Park Board of Education (Detroit); Institute of Automatics and Telemechanics (Moscow, USSR); Telemecanique Electric (Nanterre, France); University of Montreal; Whirlpool Corporation.

This year's Fellows represent 37 U.S. corporations and one foreign corporation; seven are with the U.S. government, three with foreign governments, two are in education, and one each in journalism and city government.
