Three professors at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology have been elected to membership in the new Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences.

Dr. Salvador E. Luria, Nobel Prize-winning Institute Professor and Professor of Biology; Dr. Robert W. Mann, Germeshausen Professor of Mechanical Engineering; and Dr. Nevin S. Scrimshaw, Professor of Human Nutrition and Head of the department of Nutrition and Food Science, will join two M. I. T. colleagues.

Professor Walter A. Rosenblith, M. I. T. provost, and Dr. Irving M. London, Professor of Biology and Director of the Harvard-M. I. T. Program in Health Sciences and Technology, who were among 29 charter members of the Institute when it was created by the National Academy of Sciences last fall. Including newly elected members, the total membership of the Institute now stand at 108.

Dr. Luria lives at (48 Peacock Farm Rd.) Lexington, Mass. Dr. Mann lives at (5 Peabody Rd.) in Lexington. Dr. Scrimshaw lives at (12 Valentine St.) West Newton, Mass.
